QANA GUIDELINES

- The Queen Anne Neighborhood Alliance (QANA) is a civic group committed to creating a strong sense of collective community in Seattle's Queen Anne Neighborhood. QANA is managing The Community Tent in order to allow Queen Anne residents to learn from and interact with the many interesting community groups from around our neighborhood and city. All organizations - formal or informal - are welcome to sign up for a space in the Community Tent. We are excited to help you spread the word about your amazing organizations/activities!
- Our goal at the market is to host as many community groups as possible over the summer. Groups are welcome to come more than once per season, but please understand that we will prioritize groups for variety.
- We strongly encourage interactive ideas for connecting with the market public. Come ready to talk to neighbors about your projects, and bring interactive displays or props if possible.
- The Community Tent schedule will be final and set 4 weeks prior to the market date, so that groups have a chance to prepare and organize for the event. On the day of the market, please arrive to the Community Tent at 2:30-2:45pm to give us all enough time to effectively set up the tent. The market begins at 3pm and ends at 7:30, and we would hope that you can stay for the entire time.
- All QAFM rules apply to the community groups are a part of the QANA tent.

QAFM RULES

- The Market retains the right to regulate the time, place and manner of activities relating to displays, signs, posters, placards and other expressions of the interests represented. The use of material that may offend a market customer, obscenities, or inflammatory slogans likely to provoke a disturbance are prohibited and will be subject to interpretation by the Market Manager, staff, Board and/or volunteers.
- At no time may representatives walk through the Market handing out information or soliciting. Groups may not aggressively solicit donations at the Market. A donation jar is permitted. Groups may not sell or give away any items intended for human consumption.
- Participants are responsible for keeping their space attractive during Market hours and for cleaning up their space after the Market closes, including removal of garbage and sweeping up any debris.
- The QAFM Steering Committee has authorized the Market Manager to enforce the above rules. Violation could mean future tabling exclusion at the Market. The Market cannot endorse the opinions or positions of any group or individual.
